A message from Pastor Fred...

Grace and Peace to You,



I give thanks to God for the gift of faith. Faith isn't something we can generate on our own, but we are saved by God's grace through faith, and God does this freely, giving up his own Son, so that we may know of and be enveloped in God's eternal love. I can't help but give thanks, though I cannot even fathom the expanse of God's grace and generosity.

God gives abundantly to you and to me, but what does that mean for us?

A gift is something special in our realm of human economics. A gift is something that doesn't require anything in return. If someone were to give something and expect something back, we would consider that a transaction. A gift doesn't have any strings attached; it isn't given to control the recipient to ensure something happens in the future. It is simply something given out of love. What the recipient of that gift does with the gift is up to them.

Romans 12:3-8 "For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness."

God has poured God's grace on you and given you many gifts. What is something you love that God has given you the ability to do?

I give thanks to God that I can explore the love of God with people. It's something that's so unfathomably expansive, and yet even with my human-sized brain, I can talk about it, and it brings me great joy to do so. God has given me this gift; do I have to use it? I'm not forced to, but I love to share the love of God with you and the whole world!

Think about your gifts and how much joy you get from sharing what God has given you with the world. It is a gift to have an opportunity to serve. *Imagine if I wanted to tell the world about God's love, but no one was here.*What's great is that St. James has many opportunities available where you can put the gifts God has given to you to good use! If you've seen something that needs some extra attention, and you're the one to fill that need, we all benefit. It's a way that the body of Christ comes together in wholeness.

Pray about how the gifts God has given you fit into the world, and notice how in doing so you are filled. As St. James we have come together as one body to live out Christ's love in the world around us. Our gifts change and grow, and we want to make sure that everyone has an opportunity to share their gifts with the Kingdom of God, so in the next few weeks we will have Time and Talent sheets available, where you can indicate if there is a way you can share your gifts with the body of Christ. Serving is a great way to live into our faith. The world is our mission field, and it is a joy to share Christ's love alongside you while sharing our gifts!
